

Dear all,

As you are aware we are currently in the process of resurfacing Military Road. Once again, thank you for your co-operation and understanding. We do appreciate the work will have an impact on you and/or your business and we are working to keep this to a minimum.

Programme

During the first phase of the works, we identified additional areas that required strengthening. This extra work has now been completed but as a result there has been an impact on the published programme. Details of works over the next few days are as follows:

Friday 5th October 2018

The day shift are working in phase 2 currently as planned, but the night shift will return to work in phase 1 from 6pm this evening. To allow these works, phase 1 & phase 2 will be closed until 07:00 tomorrow morning.

Saturday 6th October 2018

From 07:00 on Saturday 6th October, the road closure will be in phase 2 only (but only between Dinosaur Isle and Chine Lane). There will be verge works taking place in phase 2 (under the road closure) and phase 3 (under stop & go), between 07:30 and 16:00.

Saturdays 7th October 2018

Phase 2 will remain closed (but only between Dinosaur Isle and Chine Lane). There will be verge works taking place in phase 3 and phase 4 (under stop & go), between 08:00 and 14:00.

Monday 8th October 2018

To allow verge works to be completed safely, phase 2 will be closed for surfacing, along with the section of phase 1 up to the south east of Marsh Green Farm from 06:00 hours on Monday.

Access

The gate situated at Chale will remain open over the weekend.

Access to Dinosaur Farm will be from the Brighstone end.

Access to Shepherds Chine Shooting Ground will Chale.

Other Information

Ongoing survey work to establish whether or not there are any badgers living within the worksite has also been concluded. This work has resulted in the discovery of badger activity underneath the highway near Shepherds Chine. We are working with an environmental expert to ensure the necessary work can go ahead in accordance with our legal requirements and without having a detrimental effect on the badger population. This activity will mean a short section we were hoping to complete in phase two will now be completed towards the end of the scheme.
